- 1. CARES Act Funding
 - a. Non-Cares Act counties received additional money in December. Anything that is not eligible under CARES act you can submit to FEMA.
- 2. NJIIS
 - a. NJAC is working on getting access to vaccine data so you can target certain groups.
- 3. Cottage Food Bills
 - a. S73 – 2020 made it through the assembly and made a board list. This bill required onsite inspections by Health Departments.
 - b. Keeping an eye on it for this year
 - c. S283 – Baked Goods at Farm Markets
 - i. Reported from committee in the Senate and being heard in the assembly
- 4. Legalization of Marijuana
 - a. The cleanup bill is in the senate
 - b. The Black Caucus is concerned about impact on minority communities
 - c. Discussion on what law enforcement can do with minors
 - d. Not sure what the final bill will look like.
- 5. A5215- Medicaid Fraud
 - a. Looking at 3rd party billing
 - b. Will probably not pass because of the federal regulations
- 6. S3093 – County Mitigation Plan
 - a. Allows businesses to operate county by county or municipality by municipality

 - b. Processed and submitted the NJACCHO 2nd Quarter NJDOH Grant Process Report

- c. Looking at the use of LINC's and/or alternate redundant emergency communications system for use with our constituents – to be tested March 2021 LINC'S
 - d. Reviewing and will update (as appropriate) or recreate the Association's Continuity of Operation Plan (COOP). Last updated 2019.
 - e. In collaboration with NJDOH and other state-funded associations, will be developing a workgroup to develop checklist for OEM's in evaluating all healthcare EOP's
7. PHACE Update – Kevin Sumner
- a. PHACE reorganized last month for the year 2021. While some of the representatives have changed, the purpose and direction of PHACE was maintained. All agreed that previously approved organizing documents were as relevant as ever and did not need to be changed.
 - b. At its meeting in January all representatives voted to support the proposal by M. Avallone to develop a program to get legislators to pledge not to take funds from vaccine resistant organizations. Working with a staff person and/or interns we will seek to get every legislator to agree and will promote those who do and do not sign the pledge.
 - c. Most recently, PHACE representatives (one from each member association) agreed to act as a project working group with the Bloustein School on a NJ public health system assessment. The Bloustein School received funding from RWJ Foundation to assess the current NJ system as compared to other states, survey members of the public, and make suggestions on actions to improve the system, especially around funding.
 - d. Finally, PHACE continues to be interested in, advocate for, and monitor conversations and actions relevant to the development of a public health institute in New Jersey and new actions are reportedly pending.
8. NACCHO Update – Kevin Sumner
- a. NACCHO Annual 2021 is scheduled for June 29 – July 1, 2021 in Detroit, Michigan. Registration should open soon and this conference will be offered as in-person (at least currently) or virtual! See www.nacchoannual.org/home for more details. Note that the public health informatics conference is being co-located with NACCHO Annual this year and should provide a number of diverse offerings. The theme for the conference is: NACCHO 360: Driving Public Health Forward.
 - b. NACCHO's annual leadership conference will be held virtually, including meetings with federal legislators. Margy and I will be meeting with legislators to discuss support for local health departments and the challenges associated with COVID-19 response.
 - c. Finally, NACCHO will likely be looking for volunteer committee and Board members in the not-too-distant future. Considering that the majority of the nation's local health departments serve populations less than 50,000 and a very high percentage

of NACCHO's members also serve these smaller jurisdictions, there will be an effort to recruit from small health departments. If you have an interest in the nation's health, in working and collaborating with colleagues across the country, and addressing public health issues that impact us all, while at the same time representing New Jersey and small health departments please consider applying for any upcoming opportunities.

9. NJACCHO COVID Grant (grants@njaccho.org)

- a. Disbursed over 4M to date; \$800 K Remaining
- b. Monday, February 22nd is the Absolute Deadline to spend and submit invoices. If all funds have not been disbursed on that date, then I will begin utilizing the reallocation plan and all funds will be disbursed by March 15th.

 - v. Paschal agreed and said we need to have to come out strong for PH and build infrastructure. This is a time for us to be at the table and advocate for our ourselves.
 - vi. Chris M asked how to we get our message across to legislatures that we still need to build PH.
 - vii. Mark C. – Politics is a benefit as a way of being heard.
 - viii. Derrick said PH is a Buzz word Now and people are hiding behind it. We need to educate and be vocal. "Begin at Home"

1. Youth Camps

- a. Executive Order 149
 - i. Authorized camp operations, attestation form, prohibited overnight camps and municipal camps to register.
 - ii. Will be updating to separate out from daycares, allowing overnight to operate, no attestation, and no fee for municipal camps.
- b. Youth Camp COVID Summary
 - i. While camps did report positive cases, no outbreaks
 - ii. Early action, information/resources and non-pharmaceutical interventions worked
 - iii. It was requested to make the report available to LHDs
- c. Youth Camp Application Form
 - i. Being revised to an automatic application
 - ii. It is anticipated it will be our mid-April to May
 - iii. Will have an expedited search function
 - iv. Will capture COVID data
 - v. Providers will be notified via email
 - vi. Pre-Operation Inspections will include COVID questions and you can use the excel spreadsheet
 - 1. After inspection send to the state

- d. PRB
 - i. Ocean and Tidal bathing Beaches – EO 143 Guides Activities
 - ii. Working with legal on clarity
 - iii. Working on updating guides and EOS
 - iv. Discontinued 120 extension for lifeguard
 - v. Instituting 120 day provisional guide
 - 1. For fully licensed only, can complete online and then have 120 to demonstrate skills
 - vi. American Aquatics Safety and Training is now a recognized lifeguard certification company
- e. Cottage Food Rules
 - i. NJ is the last state prohibiting Home Baked Goods (HBG)
 - ii. New Rule Proposed
 - 1. Cottage food permit issues by NJDOH
 - 2. No inspection
 - 3. Requires Serv Safve
 - 4. \$100 fee for 2 years
 - 5. Defines cottage food operator and updates definition for retail food establishment
 - 6. Cottage Food is defined as non TCS food and must list on their application, cannot make more than \$50,000 and no wholesale food or 3rd party delivery out of state

7. Must post permit and label items
- iii. The proposed rule change was posted last April and received over 900 comments. Working on preparing responses and notice of adoption is being prepared.
- iv. If the law passes (S73) it would pre-empt the chapter.
- v. NJDOH would handle all the complaints and invite LHD
- vi. NJDOH would have a searchable database

Walter Beland – CEHA

1. CEHA Grant is now on Sage
 - a. Working through SAGE issues since the grant pulls from 8 different funding sources.
 - b. Counties need to check profiles to make sure all of the approvals are set.
