Frank J. Osborne Memorial Award Application

The Frank J. Osborne Memorial Award has been presented by the New Jersey Association of County and City Health Officials (formerly the New Jersey Health Officers Association) since 1963, in recognition for meritorious achievement in public health. NJACCHO established the Osborne Award in honor of the "dean of New Jersey Health Officers," Frank J. Osborne, who served the city of East Orange with distinction as its Health Officer from 1924 to 1961.

His accomplishments to the practice of public health in New Jersey included being a member of the State Board of Health from 1945 until 1947 and subsequently being appointed by the State Commissioner of Health in the 1950s to chair a committee of municipal health officers that drafted a list of Recognized Public Health Activities. These activities were drafted as expectations for all health departments and a set of Minimum Standards by which to evaluate them. The Public Health Council of the State Department of Health subsequently adopted them as standards to which all good health departments should conform, commonly known as Practice Standards.
